COMMUNAL MEAL TOUR PROGRAM

The Amana Arts Guild hosted six communal meal tours in 2011. Visitors from Oelwein, Decorah, Knoxville, Marion, Nevada, Dyersville, and Cresco came to the Arts Guild Center in High Amana to experience an authentic Amana Colonies communal meal. This program came about as an extension of a pilot program designed and implemented by volunteer coordinator Paula Blessman in 2010. Paula has worked with a number of regional bus tour companies to bring groups of visitors to the Amana Colonies to so that they can experience this part of Amana cultural history.

FRIEND OF THE ARTS AWARD

The Amana Arts Guild presented the 2011 Friend of the Arts Award to local craftsman R.C. Eichacker at the annual Festival of the Arts in Middle Amana on Saturday, August 12. Each year, this award recognizes the achievements of an individual who has demonstrated exceptional interest, support and understanding of the promotion of the arts and crafts in the Amana Colonies.

Born in Homestead in 1933, R.C. Eichacker has been an outstanding achiever in organizing and promoting craft events in the Amana Colonies. Prior to 1983, R.C. had been a frequent exhibitor in art and craft festivals around the state of Iowa. While attending these festivals, he noticed a large number of woodcrafters displaying and selling work. This gave him the idea that a market existed for an all wood show and in 1983, Holzfest was born. From 1983 to 1998, R.C. organized and promoted the Holzfest wood festival located at the Little Amana I80 exit. This event attracted woodworkers from around the Midwest to exhibit their woodcrafts, as well as attracting visitors to the area. Later R.C. added Eisenfest and Splinterfest to the list of his local events.

R.C. also owned and operated his own woodworking business and shop beginning in 1978 where he produced walnut cutout photo-mounts and his trademark personalized back massagers also known as rollers. In 2003, he published a book on the subject titled Rolling Along Together.

Recently, R.C. has become involved in several projects with the Amana Arts Guild. In addition to attending the Festival of the Arts as an artist participant, he has been the organizer and promoter of the Woodfest which is a woodworkers show and sale similar to Holzfest which was discontinued soon after 1998. R.C. Eichacker will also be teaching a parent/child woodcrafting class on Saturday, December 10th, 10am-noon at the Amana Arts Guild Center in High Amana. This class is called Art Pocket Crafting Class. Students ages 3 and up will learn to make a personalized wall mounted storage unit for displaying and storing a child's art work. All children taking this class must be accompanied by an adult partner. The cost is \$10 per student. For information, contact the Amana Arts Guild or the instructor R.C. Eichacker.





FALL FIBRE & CLAY SHOW

The Amana Arts Guild Center in High Amana sponsored the annual Fall Fibre & Clay Show on Saturday and Sunday, November 5-6. Artists from the state of Iowa demonstrated crafts and sold rugs, baskets, pottery, and other items.

All work displayed at the show must be hand made, original designs by the participating artist. Mass produced or imported items are not allowed. The artist booth fee is \$35 for the two day show.
